I. DEFINITIONS OF TYPES OF TOURNAMENTS AND TEAMS

(Place corresponding letter in appropriate space on application.)

TYPES OF TOURNAMENTS

UT UNRESTRICTED TOURNAMENT: A tournament that is open to all Federation affiliated participants. Any tournament that allows international participants must be an Unrestricted Tournament.

RT RESTRICTED TOURNAMENT: A tournament that is open only to members of US Youth Soccer and its State Associations.

SELECT TEAMS (teams formed by a selection or tryout process):

S1 generally a team which competes at the highest level of play in a state or region
S2 generally a team which competes at other than the highest level of play in a state or region
S3 generally a team which competes in a local area or state

TOURNAMENT SELECT TEAMS

S4 a team which is put together for the sole purpose of playing in a tournament or other sanctioned non-league competition, whose roster includes select players who are members of one club.

RECREATIONAL TEAMS

RT a team which was formed in a random nature without regard to players' abilities.

US YOUTH SOCCER ODP TEAMS

ODP TEAM: the official US Youth Soccer Olympic Development team of US Youth Soccer, any of its regions, a State Association, an Affiliate, other Organization Member, or any district or geographical subdivisions thereof.

NATIONAL TEAMS

NATIONAL TEAM: the official national team of US Soccer or any other member of FIFA.

II. HOSTING RESTRICTED AND UNRESTRICTED TOURNAMENTS AND GAMES

APPLYING TO HOST RESTRICTED TOURNAMENTS OR GAMES

1. These procedures apply when hosting ONLY US Youth Soccer State Association or US Youth Soccer Affiliates teams for tournaments or games.
2. Applications, agreements to host and other required information must be submitted as provided by the designated approving association or affiliate to include:

Not later than the date established by the State Association or Affiliate for submitting an Application to Host a Tournament or Games, the hosting organization must submit to its State Association or Affiliate and, if any game is to be played in another State Association or Affiliate, to that other State Association or Affiliate, for approval a completed Application to Host a Tournament or Games signed by the designated official of the hosting organization and the following items:
 - a) a completed US Youth Soccer Tournament or Games Hosting Agreement, with appropriate supporting documents and information, signed by the president or chief officer or designee of the hosting organization and by the tournament or games director;
 - b) a copy of the approved Rules for the Tournament or Games; and
 - c) any fees required by the State Association or Affiliate for processing the application. Incomplete applications will be returned and considered as not having ever been submitted.
3. The State Association or Affiliate is not required to approve any application not submitted by the deadline established by the State Association or Affiliate. Any application which is not submitted in a timely manner may be subject to late fees if approved. The team must contact its State Association for its specific policies and fees.
4. The State Association or US Youth Soccer Affiliate shall make a determination as to whether or not they will sanction the tournament or games in accordance with the policies they have established within their organization for the sanctioning of tournaments or games.

APPLYING TO HOST UNRESTRICTED TOURNAMENTS INCLUDING INTERNATIONAL TEAMS (TEAMS FROM OUTSIDE THE UNITED STATES) AND OTHER FEDERATION ORGANIZATION MEMBERS

1. The provisions below are in addition to those required as stated above under "Applying to Host Restricted Tournaments or Games". All those provisions so stated above must also be complied with.
2. For all tournaments and games involving international teams (teams from outside the United States), the Rules for the Tournament or Games must comply with the following substitution requirements: For matches involving players under 16 years of age, the number of substitutions allowed is as provided by the Rules of the Tournament or Game. For all other matches, the number of substitutions is as agreed to prior to the match and the referee is informed prior to the match of that number. The number agreed to can be as provided in the Rules of the Tournament or Game.
3. The completed US Soccer forms Application to Host a Tournament or Games Involving Foreign Teams and Certification Regarding Compliance with the Ted Stevens and Olympic Amateur Sports Act, must be submitted and approved by the hosting State Association or US Youth Soccer Affiliate and any additional fees required by the State Association, Affiliate and/or the United States Soccer Federation for processing the application.
4. For all teams that are not members of US Youth Soccer or a US Youth Soccer Affiliate, Proof of medical and liability insurance must be provided by their organization of registration

TOURNAMENT OR GAMES HOSTING AGREEMENT

In consideration of permission being granted to Lakewood Steilacoom Dupont SC to hold a tournament or games at Lakewood Steilacoom Dupont SC Lakewood WA
 (Hosting Organization) (City) (State)

On the dates of August 18-19th, 2018, we agree to the following conditions:

ABIDE BY RULES: We shall abide by all statements made in our approved US Youth Soccer *Application to Host A Tournament or Games*, in our tournament invitation, in our tournament rules, in the US Youth Soccer *Travel and Tournament Policy* and in this US Youth Soccer *Tournament or Games Hosting Agreement*. We agree that all decisions regarding acceptance of teams into a tournament shall be fairly and impartially made and shall not be based upon race, creed, color or national origin and that we will not advertise by any means the tournament or games until all approvals are received.

INVITATIONS: The tournament or games approval form shall accompany all tournament or games invitations distributed.

HOUSING: We agree that we will not require a team to use only accommodations approved or provided by the hosting organization or other organization, unless disclosure is made on the tournament application form of the required hotel/motel names and the guaranteed rates.

PROCURING LIABILITY INSURANCE: We have procured liability insurance coverage for the tournament or games with limits of not less than \$1,000,000/\$2,000,000 which names the State Association or Affiliate with which the Hosting Organization is a member. A copy of the certificate of insurance, IF REQUIRED, is attached issued by Acord.

REQUIRING MEDICAL AUTHORIZATIONS: We shall require all teams participating in the tournament or games to provide medical releases for each player in an appropriate form. These authorizations shall be reviewed by the Hosting Organization at registration and kept in the possession of a team official.

ADVANCE PUBLICATION OF RULES: We agree that our tournament or games rules shall be included with the invitation sent to each team and shall, again, be published to all teams accepted prior to the start of the tournament/games.

CREDENTIALS CHECKS: We agree that we shall conduct credentials checks to ensure that all players are registered with US Youth Soccer or US Soccer or a member thereof or their national association, properly rostered with their team, and participating in accordance with representations set forth on the US Youth Soccer *Application to Host a Tournament or Games*. We agree that we will not modify or mark in any way original rosters or member passes; and will not register any player, coach, or team official or issue any member pass.

USE OF US SOCCER REGISTERED REFEREES: We agree that we shall use for all games only US Soccer registered referees who are in good standing (unless US Soccer has granted a waiver to allow the use of authorized referees from another country), and shall use a one- or 3-referee system. We intend to use a 3-referee system for the following age groups: None. There will be an adequate number of US Soccer registered referees available in the area during the tournament or game dates to cover the scheduled games. TOURNAMENT OR GAME RULES – BEHAVIOR: We agree that our tournament or game rules contain provisions ensuring that the behavior of teams, players, coaches, and spectators is appropriately controlled, including specific provisions that—

- Spell out the disciplinary measures to be imposed for the issuance of red and yellow cards or other improper conduct;
- indicate what procedures will be followed regarding protests and appeals;

- indicate that all disciplinary measures imposed by hosting organizations shall be limited to placing restrictions upon an individual's group participation in the tournament/games;
- record the issuance of all red and yellow cards and other matters involving the conduct of a team, its players, coaches, and supporters and also report them immediately to the home State Association and the home club/league of the team; and
- state that the home State Association or member thereof and the home club or league shall, except in the case of referee assault or abuse, have the responsibility for imposing, should circumstances warrant, additional penalties within their respective jurisdictions with regard to any matters arising from the tournament or games.

TOURNAMENT CANCELLATION: We agree that our tournament or game rules shall state what refunds, if any, shall be made to participating teams if all or a portion of the tournament or games is cancelled by the hosting organization for any reason.

POST TOURNAMENT OR GAMES REPORT: We agree that we shall file any required Post Tournament or Games Report with the State Association or Affiliate granting us permission to host this tournament or games within 30 days after the conclusion of the tournament or games. We understand that failure to file the report may preclude the tournament/games host from receiving approval for any tournament/games for the following seasonal years until the report is filed. The Post Tournament or Games Report shall include the following information:

- the number of teams participating in each age group (boys and girls);
- if a champion is determined, the name of the champion for each group;
- the number of teams from each State Association, Affiliate, other Organization Member, or foreign country;
- if "Sportsmanship Awards" are given, the criteria for the award and to whom awards were given;
- the number of fields used for the tournament/games;
- the name of the sponsor, if any; and
- the names and teams of all players issued red and yellow cards, and details of any other matters involving the improper or unsporting conduct of a team, its players, coaches or supporters. **NOTE: Any incident of referee assault or referee abuse by a player, coach, manager, club official, or game official must be reported to the alleged offender's home State Association, or member thereof immediately, but in no event later than 48 hours after an incident of referee assault or abuse..**

2. a completed *Tournament Hosting Agreement*, if you are requesting permission to host a tournament, with appropriate supporting data, signed by the President or Chief Officer of the Host Organization, and by the Tournament Director;
3. a copy of the Rules for the Tournament or Games ;
4. applicable fee (\$75.00) made payable to U.S. Soccer: 30 or more days in advance;

After ensuring that your team or organization is in good standing, U.S. Soccer will then submit a copy of your tournament rules to FIFA (Federation Internationale de Football Association) requesting approval. Upon approval, U.S. Soccer will return the approved application to the hosting organization, and a copy to the State Association/Sectional Director.

U.S. Soccer will notify the federation from which the teams are traveling to compete in the tournament are associated.

- 10. AVAILABILITY OF POLICE AND RESCUE SERVICE - We have notified the local police, ambulance and emergency rescue services of the date of the tournament or games and the times and fields which will be used for games, and have been advised by them that they will be available to render assistance if needed.
11. TOURNAMENT RULES/BEHAVIOR - We agree that our tournament or games rules contain provisions ensuring that the behavior of teams, players, coaches and spectators is appropriately controlled including specific provisions:

TED STEVENS OLYMPIC AND AMATEUR SPORTS ACT

§220525. Granting sanctions for amateur athletic competitions

- (a) **PROMPT REVIEW AND DECISION.**—For the sport that it governs, a national governing body promptly shall—
- (1) review a request by an amateur sports organization or person for a sanction to hold an international amateur athletic competition in the United States or to sponsor United States amateur athletes to compete in international amateur athletic competition outside the United States; and
 - (2) grant the sanction if—
 - (A) the national governing body does not decide by clear and convincing evidence that holding or sponsoring an international amateur athletic competition would be detrimental to the best interest of the sport; and
 - (B) the requirements of subsection (b) of this section are met
- (b) **REQUIREMENTS.**—An amateur sports organization or person may be granted a sanction under this section only if the organization or person meets the following requirements—
- (1) The organization or person must pay the national governing body any required sanctioning fee, if the fee is reasonable and nondiscriminatory.
 - (2) For a sanction to hold an international amateur athletic competition in the United States, the organization or person must—
 - (A) submit to the national governing body an audited or notarized financial report of similar events, if any, conducted by the organization or person; and
 - (B) demonstrate that the requirements of paragraph (4) of this subsection have been met.
 - (3) For a sanction to sponsor United States amateur athletes to compete in international amateur athletic competition outside the United States, the organization or person must—
 - (A) submit a report of the most recent trip to a foreign country, if any, that the organization or person sponsored for the purpose of having United States amateur athletes compete in international amateur athletic competition; and
 - (B) submit a letter from the appropriate entity that will hold the international amateur athletic competition certifying that the requirements of paragraph (4) of this subsection have been met.
 - (4) The requirements referred to in paragraphs (2) and (3) of this subsection are that—
 - (A) appropriate measures have been taken to protect the amateur status of athletes who will take part in the competition and to protect their eligibility to compete in amateur athletic competition;
 - (B) appropriate provision has been made for validation of any records established during the competition;
 - (C) due regard has been given to any international amateur athletic requirements specifically applicable to the competition;
 - (D) the competition will be conducted by qualified officials;
 - (E) proper medical supervision will be provided for athletes who will participate in the competition; and
 - (F) proper safety precautions have been taken to protect the personal welfare of the athletics and spectators at the competition.

DAVE PAINTON CUP 5V5 2018 RULES and REGULATIONS
U10-U19 District Select and Recreational Teams (US Club and USYSA affiliated teams)

1. The Dave Painton Cup guarantees four (4) matches per team, with a max of 8 depending on how many teams enter at each age group. The round robin portion of the tournament will take place on Saturday. Each team will play three games and will then be re-seeded based on points into a single elimination bracket. All teams playing on Saturday will play at least one more match on Sunday.
2. The duration of each match is 26 minutes - two halves of 12 minutes each. Halftime will consist of 2 minutes.
 - A. Match times and fields are listed in the tournament program and are posted on the tournament scoreboard. If changes occur during the tournament, we will make every effort to notify you. We also publish on the Web site, a schedule. **PLEASE CHECK FREQUENTLY AS CHANGES ALWAYS OCCUR!** We try not to make changes but because of the tight scheduling requirements, mistakes do occur and we try to catch as many as possible before tourney time. It is the responsibility of the coach to look and see if points are correct. Mistakes do occur, the sooner you help us catch them, the less likelihood there will be for delays and confusion.
3. **ROSTERS will be composed of no more than 10 players. ALL PLAYERS WILL WEAR TEAR PROOF BRACELETS ON THEIR RIGHT WRIST. EACH TEAM WILL BE ISSUED A NUMBER IDENTIFYING THEM FROM THE OTHER TEAMS. THESE ARE TO BE WORN TO PREVENT PLAYERS SWITCHING ROSTERS. PLAYERS WILL NOT BE ALLOWED TO PLAY WITHOUT A WRIST BAND. A team may have 2 guest players on their team. These players must be added to your roster and verified by your club registrar. Guest players MUST be properly registered with Washington Youth Soccer or US Club. Adult Co-Ed teams must have 2 female players on the field at all times.**
4. Regular soccer rules will prevail with the following exceptions:
 - A. There is NO off-side law.
 - B. Each half of the match will be started with a drop ball at the center mark. Players must be in their own half of the field.
 - C. The size of the fields is 40 yards by 60 yards for all age groups. Goals are approximately 6x12 ft.
 - D. Goalkeepers may not punt the ball into play. Goalie must distribute the ball by throwing, rolling, or passing the ball out on the ground.
 - E. After a goal is scored, the defending team will restart play with a goalkeeper distribution (refer to 4D.) **NO OPPOSING PLAYERS ARE ALLOWED WITHIN THE GOAL AREA ON A RESTART OF ANY KIND (AFTER A GOAL OR A GOAL KICK) EVEN IF THE KEEPER DROPS THE BALL TO HIS/HER FEET TO DISTRIBUTE, THE BALL IS NOT LIVE UNTIL IT LEAVES THE GOAL AREA (10 YARD LINE). THIS DOES NOT APPLY TO THE RUN OF PLAY. IF THE GOALKEEPER DROPS THE BALL TO HIS OR HER FEET AFTER A SAVE OR AFTER PICKING IT UP DURING THE RUN OF PLAY, IT IS LIVE IMMEDIATELY AND THE OPPOSITION CAN CHALLENGE INSIDE THE 10 YARD BOX.**
 - F. Goal kicks can be taken anywhere within the goal area, which extends 10 yards from the goal line, and from touch line to touch line.
 - G. Fouls that occur within the goal area WILL NOT result in a penalty kick. All fouls inside the goal area will result in an indirect free kick from the spot of the foul, extended to the 10 yard line.
 - E. **NO SLIDE TACKLING...** No slide tackling! We all want to go home in one piece. This will be cited as a yellow card unless flagrant, in which case it will be cited as a red card. A slide tackle, according to this tournament, is where a player slides one or two feet on the ground in an attempt to get ball AND alters the steps on the opposing player. A player who slides to save a ball from going out of bounds with no opponent in the vicinity is not considered a slide tackle.
 - F. Substitutions will be "on the fly" but must take place at midfield. The player entering may not enter the field until the player coming off is within 2 yards of the touch line.
 - G. All Free Kicks are Indirect

5. All teams should have an alternate jersey available in case of a color conflict. The team listed first on the schedule of that match must change.
6. Match times and fields are listed in the tournament program and posted on the Tournament flow charts placed in an area that is easily accessible. It is the responsibility of each team to know where and when they play.
FORFEITS: A forfeit will be "played out". This means that the team that showed up will take the ball from the beginning and score the point. **Be sure not to miss!** The ball will stay in the opposing net until the end of the game or until the opposing team shows up and gets the ball out of their own net to begin play. This also means that teams can be late and still play. They will of course be behind by a goal. The forfeit will be official at the end of the game.
7. The referee is the sole judge of play on the field. However, time will be kept by an official time keeper who will start each match and indicate the finish of each half with a blast on a horn. All scheduled matches start and finish at the same time. The announcer will give a "1 minute to go" signal over the PA system prior to the beginning of the matches. **REFEREES WILL NOT BE KEEPING THEIR OWN TIME ON THE FIELD. THE HORN WILL GOVERN THE BEGINNING AND ENDING OF EACH MATCH.**
CAUTION: AT THE SOUND OF THE HORN, THE REFEREE WILL DROP THE BALL WHETHER YOUR TEAM IS ON THE FIELD OR NOT.
8. The tournament director and his assistants will govern all matters pertaining to the Dave Painton Cup.
9. Each team must have an adult coach. Each team should provide a match ball.
SIZE 4 balls will be used IN ALL GROUPS THAT INCLUDE ANY U9-U12 teams. This means that if you are a U13 team playing in a mixed group with U12 teams, you will be using a size 4 ball.
10. Team members must be properly registered with the Washington Youth Soccer or US Club. CHECK-IN PROCEDURES: All teams must check in at the registration tent prior to their first match. A roster signed by your club registrar must be presented at check in time. AN APPROVED ROSTER REPORTING FORM CAN BE FOUND ON THE TOURNAMENTS PAGE AT WWW.LAKEWOODSOCCERCLUB.ORG TEAMS MAY NOT HAVE MORE THAN 10 PLAYERS ON THEIR ROSTER AND THESE ARE THE ONLY PLAYERS WHO MAY PARTICIPATE IN THE TOURNAMENT. **THIS TOURNAMENT DOES NOT ALLOW "PICK UP" TEAMS OR PLAYERS THAT ARE NOT PROPERLY REGISTERED WITH A CLUB WITHIN USYSA OR US CLUB SOCCER.**
11. Coaches may enter two teams from their regular season roster. Each team entered will require a registration form and entry fee. Separate and distinct uniforms must be worn to distinguish players from each team. Players cannot transfer from team to team over the weekend.

The Dave Painton Cup is open to U10-U17 age groups based on the **2018-2019** guidelines. U17-U19 teams will play in a combined "High School" bracket unless we have enough teams to separate them.

POINTS

Teams shall be awarded points for Saturday's match results as follows:

Win = 6 points

Draw = 3 points

Loss = 0 points

1 point for every goal scored up to 3 (for both teams)

1 point for a shut out (not applicable in 0-0 games)

In the case of a forfeit, the winning team will be awarded maximum points (10)

Ties will stand during the preliminary round. In the event of a draw on Elimination Sunday, games will be decided via Kicks From The Mark (PK's)

KFTM PROCEDURE

In the event that KFTM are needed to decide a match, each team will pick 5 players to participate, they may chose from any 5 players on their roster; the players do not need to be on the field at the conclusion of the match. These will be the only 5 players to participate and will recycle through if it takes more than 5 kicks.

In the event that two or more teams are tied in points at the end of the round robin, the following tie breakers shall be used in order given to determine seed number.

- A. Results of a head-to-head competition.
- B. Goals against
- C. Goals scored
- D. Coin toss

In the event that a team plays (4) games during the round robin due to an odd number of teams in the age bracket; **THAT TEAMS TOTAL POINTS WILL BE MULTIPLIED BY .75 (example....you earned 28 points through 4 matches. Your total will be multiplied by .75 and your point total will be adjusted to 21)**

AWARDS

Trophies will be awarded for first place in each division. Individual medals will also be awarded for first and second place finishers. (10 medals per team).

DISCIPLINARY

1. The Disciplinary committee chairperson shall adjudicate all disputes or abandoned games. The Judiciary Director is empowered to issue appropriate penalties necessary to obtain compliance with the spirit and purpose of the tournament, up to and including disqualification of any offending team from further participation. The decision of the Judiciary Director is final.
2. No protest will be allowed.
At the conclusion of each match, the official will give the Disciplinary committee chairperson the first and last names, jersey number, team name, and an explanation of circumstances for every player cautioned and/or sent from the field.
3. Any player receiving a caution shall receive one (1) misconduct point. Any player receiving a sending off shall receive two (2) misconduct points. Any player accumulating two (2) misconduct points shall be automatically suspended from the next game. Any player accumulating four (4) or more misconduct points shall be automatically suspended from the remainder of the tournament, beginning with the next game. In addition, the Disciplinary committee chairperson reserves the right to levy stricter penalties, as deemed appropriate.
In addition, all red and yellow cards, and all other matters involving the conduct of a team, its players, coaches, and supporters will be recorded by the tournament officials. This recorded information will be reported immediately to the home state association and the home club/league of that player, coach, team, or supporters involved. All matters involving referee assault shall, in accordance with USSF Rule 1108, be referred immediately to Washington Youth Soccer. (The Host stated Association).

4. In addition, matters involving misconduct (except referee assault) may be subject to additional sanctions by the home club/league of the player, team, coach, or supporters, within their respective jurisdictions.
5. Any player ejected from a match for violent conduct, will not be allowed to play again for the balance of the tournament. An ejected player may not be replaced on the roster; however the team will not have to play a man down (5 v. 4)
