Dan Mills joined the U.S. Center for SafeSport in 2018. As the Training & Technical Assistance Manager, he is responsible for managing and facilitating all of SafeSport’s abuse prevention training programs. He also serves as a primary liaison to the Athlete Advisory Committee (AAC), working to ensure the athlete voice and perspective is heard in the Center’s efforts. Dan assists with program and curriculum development including train-the-trainer programs to ensure the Center’s prevention message gets to all persons within the U.S. Olympic and Paralympic movements.

Prior to the U.S. Center for SafeSport, Dan served as a Program Manager within the Education, Outreach, Training & Prevention division at the National Center for Missing & Exploited Children. There, he was responsible for managing and facilitating all of NCMEC’s law enforcement and child-serving professional training programs and initiatives. He also managed the operations of NCMEC’s distance learning program, NCMEC University Online, and creating content as it relates to new training courses.

Prior to training, Dan started at NCMEC as an Analyst within the Case Analysis Division. Here he worked cases of missing children and provided case managers and law enforcement with actionable intelligence on the whereabouts of missing children and their abductors. Due to his work, Dan is credited with the successful recovery of several children, some of which had been missing for over ten years.

Mr. Mills holds a triple Bachelor of Science in Criminology, Psychology and Sociology from Drury University.
