## Section 1: Important Dates and Deadlines

---

Registration deadlines and fees within this document apply to **Ohio North affiliated members** only (those that send fees directly to Ohio North). Clubs will follow the registration procedures and deadlines provided by the league in which their teams play.

***In order to provide the membership benefits to your members, players and coaches must be:***

- 1.) Registered in the Affinity Sports database for the seasonal year;
- 2.) Players and Coaches must be assigned to a team
- 3.) Coaches and Staff members must have a current Background Check on file.
- 4.) The teams must be approved by the League Registrar in which the team participates.
- 5.) Registration and payment deadlines **must** be met.
- 6.) Coaches and staff must complete an approved concussion certification course.

### **Important Dates and Deadlines**

#### **Fall**

**August 1** – Annual Membership fee and form due along with a copy of your bylaws and goal safety policy (if there have been changes.)

- [Associate Membership Form](#) - \$150

**September 1** – Fall Estimated Fees and Data due (or Final Fall fees if club is done with registration)

**October 1** – Fall Final Fees and Data due

#### **Winter**

**February 1** – All Winter fees and Data due

#### **Spring**

**April 1** – Spring Estimated Fees and Data due (or Final Spring fees if club is done with registration)

**May 1** – Spring Final Fees and Data due

#### **Summer**

**July 1** – All Summer fees and Data due

**A minimum late payment charge of \$25 or 1% of the balance will be assessed monthly on any outstanding fees not submitted by the Fall and/or Spring Final Fee Due Dates.**

#### **Estimated Fees:**

Estimated fees are 75% of membership of the prior seasonal year. Fees will be posted on the Registration page of the Ohio North website <http://www.ohionorthsoccer.org/registration/> .

New members' estimated fees will be \$300 for the first fall season.

All final fees should be accompanied by a fee transmittal form that can be found in the forms and resources section of this document.

If you are a recreational league that does not use Affinity, please use the appropriate upload template located on <http://www.ohionorthsoccer.org/registration>. All columns must be filled in completely. This upload is only for players. Your coaches will have to do their risk management to be entered onto a team. There is an Admin template. This is used only for you to let Ohio North what coaches should go on which team after they have completed their risk management.

## Section 3: Accessing Affinity

---

**Affinity is for Ohio North Players and Coaches ONLY.** If Affinity is used for other players in other US Soccer members, *you will be charged for these players by Ohio North.* There is a separate entity within Affinity they can set up for Non-Ohio North players where you will not be charged.

### New Clubs

If your League has a new club that is not listed in Affinity, please complete the following form and submit to Ohio North. Make sure the form is completed in its entirety.

Once club information is inputted, the registrar will receive a Username and a temporary password via email from Ohio North.

### Login Procedure, Affinity Sports

To access Affinity Sports, go to [www.ohionorthsoccer.org](http://www.ohionorthsoccer.org). On the Ohio North Home Page, click the red Affinity Login Box displayed about half way down the home screen or use <http://ohionorth.affinitysoccer.com>. A login page will appear. Enter your username and password in the top left corner.

### Insurance for Board Members

League Board of Directors must be entered into Affinity to provide D&O coverage for your current Board of Directors. (Entries for BOD must include their contact information). Provide BOD members with the job of League Board Member and indicate position on Board in the spot listed as Business Title. All BOD members **must** have a current Risk

Management form on file with Ohio North. Bonding insurance is not provided through affiliation; however, Ohio North can provide information if requested.

#### Section 4.1: Standard Registration in Affinity (non-club carded players)

---

Before inputting any information into Affinity:

1. Make sure you are in the correct season and make sure you have your current season turned on. [\(INSTRUCTIONS\)](#)
2. In the beginning of a season, when looking for a player to create a new application, use “all seasons” to look them up.
3. If a player is new to your club but has played before in another club, use Family Lookup and input their last name, first name, and DOB (mm/dd/yyyy) to not create a duplicate.

*NOTE: There is a Principal Season, Spring Rec Season, Winter Season, and Summer Season. Any team made in the Principal year is valid for the entire seasonal year. If a player is switching teams within the same club between seasons, they can be transferred. The Spring Rec season is for seasonal recreational programs only. If you have an annual rec program and have new players in the spring, register them on the teams that you created for the principal season.*

#### Basic Guidelines for Registering Players/Coaches

---

##### **Player IDs**

Every player within Ohio North has an individual Player ID that is unique. A Player’s ID is randomly populated through the Affinity system.

##### **Player Divisions**

Make sure that when registering your players that they are registered to the play level that they will be playing in.

*When creating a play level, please use the above codes for uniformity.*

##### **A. Recreational Inhouse League**

1. Recreation programs are designated for local, inhouse play and can be structured around formal teams or as an academy-based format. The use of tryouts, invitations, recruiting or any like process to register players selectively to any team on the basis of ability is prohibited; and member leagues must accept any and all eligible youth players (subject to reasonable terms of registration).
2. Recreation leagues may maintain standings and hold end-of-season play-offs and players must participate in at least half of each game.

##### **B. Recreation Plus League**

1. Recreation Plus leagues are formed to provide small or isolated Recreation members with the opportunity to engage in competition with other Recreation members. League membership is often formed around zip codes, school zones, social club membership, or church affiliations.

2. The use of tryouts, invitations, recruiting or any like process to register players selectively to any team on the basis of ability is prohibited; member leagues must accept any and all eligible youth players (subject to reasonable terms of registration).
3. Recreation Plus leagues may maintain standings and hold end-of-season play-offs.

#### C. **Competitive/Travel League**

1. Competitive leagues provide an elevated level of competition for players who are more motivated to train, improve their skills, and compete against like-skilled and like-minded opponents. Competitive has an associated rise in the cost of participation, training and administrative expectations, and travel distances. Playing time is not guaranteed.
2. Competitive players generally develop from Recreational programs/leagues and league membership is generally based on local zip codes, but can also include teams from Premier clubs.
3. Tryouts can be used as the basis for team formation and players can be assigned to teams on the basis of ability.
4. Competitive teams can compete in Premier competitions, such as State League and State Cup.
5. Competitive leagues can choose if they are club carding or not.

#### D. **Premier League**

1. Premier is the most competitive tier of the youth soccer pyramid at the state level and neither playing time nor roster places are guaranteed. Premier clubs actively recruit players and tier their teams on the basis of ability. Larger clubs may have players and teams competing at each of the three lower levels.
2. Club rosters will generally include players from multiple communities and may include out of state players. The associated costs of participation and travel are significant; and professional coaching is the norm. Premier clubs compete in state, regional and national leagues.
3. The only premier leagues players can participate in Ohio North are Ohio North State League or Midwest Regional League.

#### **Annual Teams**

Teams that are created in the full seasonal year DO NOT need to be recreated in the spring. These players are registered for the entire seasonal year. If players decided to play on a different team within the same club, they need to be transferred NOT reregistered. Annual teams are generally the same roster of players for the whole seasonal year.

#### **Spring Teams (Only Recreational)**

Teams are usually registered this way because teams that are created in the fall completely change in the Spring. Players and teams that are registered/created as in the Fall, MUST be re-registered again in the Spring.

#### **Inhouse Recreational Teams**

There will not be a limit on the roster size; however, the Ohio North team approval rules will require you to register one coach for every twelve (12) players on the team.

#### **Out-of-State Permission**

Players MUST have permission from their home state, the state that they reside in, along with the accepting state, in order to play soccer in another State Association every seasonal year. *NOTE: Please remember that Ohio South is another "State Association" in US Youth Soccer.*

#### **Registering Coaches (Staff)**

- Affinity is set up to work the best **when a coach goes in and completes their risk management first.**
- Register all coaches, assistant coaches, team managers that will have contact with the team.
- All coaches and staff must have an approved Risk Management on file in order to have any interaction with the team. NOTE: Teams cannot be approved unless all coaches have a current Risk Management on file.

- All coaches and staff must complete an approved concussion certification course.

## Section 4.2: FAQs on Registering Players/Staff

---

### The best ways to do manual registration:

There are two ways to efficiently complete registration

1. Create empty teams first. Then you can create applications for each player and assign them right to the team from their application.
2. Create applications for each player (making sure you check the three boxes: Accepted, age legal, and legal waivers). Then when you create teams later, you can then just push them over to your team from the Roster Player tab.

### Multi-Application Registration

If you are trying to register a player that already has an application within your club on a different team or with a different club, please follow the rules below:

#### For all Play Levels:

-You will need to create a new application for the player. The team drop box will not be an option if this is not the player's first application. Once the application is created, go to the roster player tab on the team you are registering them for and push them over.

#### **\*\*SPECIAL RULE\*\***

*The multi-roster button will only appear on the Roster Player tab of CC-Competitive teams. You may use this feature instead of creating a new application for players within your club. They will only show up in the search if they have a CC-Competitive application and are within you club.*

### Migration Tool

Migration tool is when you have a team or multiple teams staying almost the same to exactly the same for a new seasonal year.

Only the **State Office** has access to this tool. In the past, users did not complete migrations correctly, corrupting data, so access has been limited.

If Migration is needed to be done from one seasonal year to another, please contact the State Office with the following information:

- What teams are needing to be migrated
- Are players included or not? (Admins will not be migrated from one season to the next)

*NOTE: If you have to remove any players from the roster because they are not playing with your club anymore, you **MUST CANCEL** their application. Not cancelling the applications of the players taken off of the team may result in being charged for said players.*

## Playing Formats and Roster Sizes

For local community and league play, and for teams competing in Ohio North sanctioned tournaments, the following player formats and the associated roster sizes for teams U6 to U19 have been established by US Soccer:

## Player Releases & Transfers

---

### Player Release

Ohio North Release and Transfer process is done through the Affinity System. Old player passes are to be sent to the league the player is leaving. There is no extra charge for a player release or a dropped player.

### Transferring Players

Competitive and premier teams MUST initiate the Player Release/Transfer process to the league when a player is being transferred to a new team within a different club within the same seasonal year.

- No extra charge when a player is moving from one team to another within the SAME club and league.
- Charge will be applied when:
  - A player moves from within their club to a team playing in another league and/or play level.
  - When a player transfers from one club to another club.

**How to Complete Player Transfers** [INSTRUCTIONS](#) – within same club [INSTRUCTIONS](#) – all other transfers/releases

- The Player Release/Transfer process must be used by all competitive and premier level leagues/clubs when a player requests to be released from a team or when a player requests to be transferred to a new team within a different club.
- A parent or club can initiate a Player Release/Transfer. Parents can go to their record and start the process for their player or club registrars can go to the player transfer tab and start the process there.
- The process will be as follows: Parent or Releasing Club Registrar → Playing League Registrar → Accepting Club Registrar → Accepting Playing League Registrar. Once the final approval of the Accepting playing league accepts, the transfer is complete.
- A registration fee will not be collected for transferred players within the same club.
- Fees will be collected when a player is transferred to a new team within a different club or to a new team within a different league.

**NOTE: Never unassign and delete a player or coach from a team roster if they participated in any event or activity with the league/team/club. Ohio North cannot insure any members once they have been deleted because there will be no record.**

## Section 4.3: Club Carding Registration

---

### IMPORTANT NOTES BEFORE STARTING

We've given you the opportunity to use Club Carding, however, each league must decide as a whole if they will adopt club carding. Contact Ohio North prior to the season if you will be adopting Club Carding. If you have any questions regarding Club Carding, please contact the Ohio North office.

- Under Club Carding, a “transfer” is defined as movement between two different soccer organizations (clubs) and not as an “add/drop” between two teams in the same club.
- When using Club Carding, there will be no transfer fees within the same club within the same league. If a player transfers to another club or league, there will be a new registration fee based on what the league charges.

### Club Carding

Provides soccer organizations with the flexibility to:

1. Add eligible players to a game roster in order to field a team or provide substitutes.
2. Move eligible players between Tiered teams (A/B etc.,) as deemed necessary.
3. Create discrete event rosters from the entire pool of eligible players.

### Criteria/Qualification for Registering Club Carded Members

Each league will determine if they will be using Club Carding for the upcoming seasonal year and must notify their members accordingly. *NOTE: When choosing Club Carding, you must choose for the entire league*

- The roster flexibility provided through Club Carding will be controlled by each individual league rules.
- The league will choose the Club Carding option for the entire league.
- Or, the league may continue with their current registration requirements and not adopt club carding.

### Club Carding Fees

One club carded registration fee will be billed for each competitive player participating in your league. Coaches will not be charged for each team that they are registered to.

*NOTE: You do not need to build new teams for the Spring season if you have already created an ANNUAL Team in the Fall. The Fall team will still be valid.*

### Registering Club Carded Players and Staff in Affinity

Before inputting any information into Affinity:

1. Confirm that you are in the correct season and that it is turned on.

*NOTE: You DO NOT need to build new teams for the SPRING season if you created your team as in the main season. The FALL teams are still valid. Annually registered players DO NOT have to be registered again! If they are playing on a different team in the same club, they can be TRANSFERRED.*

### Registering Club Carded Players

- Select the correct division. For Club Carded members, this will be distinguished by CC - Competitive, with “CC” standing for Club Carded.

*NOTE: You can change the division of the team/player if incorrect up until the team is approved or a player is active. Contact Ohio North if you are unable to correct the division for either a team or player.*



### **Player ID's**

Every player within Ohio North has an individual Player ID that is unique to just them. A Player's ID is created by the affinity program and is completely unique to every player.

- **Player Fee:** A player is only charged one time if placed on one core roster.
- **Out-of-State Permission:** Players MUST have permission from their home state, the state that they reside in, along with the accepting state, in order to play soccer in another State Association. Out-of-State Permission forms can be found at [www.ohionorthsoccer.org](http://www.ohionorthsoccer.org). *NOTE: Please remember that Ohio South is another "State" in US Youth Soccer.*

### **Registering Club Carded Coaches (Staff)**

- Register all coaches, assistant coaches, team managers that will have contact with the team.
- All coaches and staff must have an approved Risk Management on file in order to have ANY interaction with the team. *NOTE: Teams cannot be approved unless all team admins have a current Risk Management on file.*
- See the Risk Management section at [www.ohionorthsoccer.org](http://www.ohionorthsoccer.org) for help on how to obtain a current Risk Management.
- All coaches and staff must complete an approved concussion certification course.
- Coaches and DOC are only charged one time if placed on one core roster.
- Coaches or a DOC will not be charged again if added to an **Event Roster**.

### **Club Carded Player Release**

Ohio North requires a COMPLETED Player Release/Transfer be submitted in Affinity to the league for all players requesting to be released or dropped from a Competitive and Premier team. Old player passes are to be sent to the league the player is leaving with the COMPLETED release. There is no charge for a player release or a dropped player.

### **Transferring Club Carded Players**

Competitive and premier teams MUST COMPLETE Player Release/Transfer process in Affinity when a player is being transferred to a new team within a different club within the same seasonal year.

- No charge when a player is moving from one team to another within the SAME club and same league.
- Charge will be applied when:
  - A player moves from within their club to a team playing in another league.
  - When a player transfers from one club to another club.

### **Section 5: Travel Rosters**

---

A "Travel roster" is a set of players and coaches for an event. The system allows players and coaches to be included from many teams within the same club to create a TRAVEL ROSTER.

- Primary purpose is for printing rosters for events, such as tournaments.
  - Players must come from the same club
  - Players must have an Active Status on their club team
- Secondary Purpose is to create game rosters for CLUB CARDED TEAMS, who play in leagues that have adopted Club Carding. (Consult your league rules to determine the game roster limitations and definitions if Club Carding applies to you.)

## Section 6: Risk Management

---

Every DOC, Coach, Assistant Coach, Team Manager and Board Member must have a current Background Check on file with Ohio North before they can have any interaction with the youth.

- Risk Management can be completed by going to the Risk Management section at [www.ohionorthsoccer.org](http://www.ohionorthsoccer.org)
- A coach must have a current approved Risk Management on file in Affinity before they can have any access with players and before a team can be approved.
- To find a listing of coaches, that do not have a Risk Management, Go to “Admin Lookup” → Change the Risk Filter to “Expired” and/or “None” and hit search. A list of all coaches will come up.

## Section 7: Certificates of Insurance

---

As Ohio North members, clubs/leagues has insurance coverage. If a field or complex owner requires proof of insurance for games or practice usage insurance certificate requests can be made at [www.ohionorthsoccer.org](http://www.ohionorthsoccer.org) under “Membership Services” and “Insurance Information” on the navigation menus. This MUST be done once each seasonal year.

## Section 8: Goal Safety Policy

---

Associate and Affiliate Members MUST have a current Goal Safety Policy which MUST be on file with Ohio North.

- Submit a copy of the policy, if not already submitted or if it has been changed.
- Follow your policy by educating the parents and players about the dangers surrounding goals. Make sure coaches inspect each goal before any and all practices or games to make sure it is properly secure. NEVER use your players to move a goal. Provide all coaches with a copy of your Goal Safety Policy each season along with the Consumer Product Safety Commission guidelines.

## Section 9: Concussion Certification

---

### **Concussion Training**

#### **Free Online Courses**

There are FREE approved online training courses available. Ohio North recommends that members use the National Federation of State High School Associations (NFHS). The NFHS requires a user to login but allows leagues to track coaches' progress and allows coaches to log in and print their certification should they require a new certificate or provide Ohio North with proof of compliance.

### **Information For Leagues and Parents/Guardians**

All of Ohio North member clubs/leagues are responsible to provide a HARD COPY of the Youth Sports Concussion Information Sheet, supplied by the Ohio Department of Health, to the parent or other guardian of each athlete who wishes to practice for or compete in the league. This information must be provided yearly. Upon Ohio North's request, leagues must be able to produce evidence of compliance with this obligation.

## **Parents/Guardians**

Please be advised that a player who has been suspected of a concussion may not return to play until they are provided a written clearance that it is safe for the individual to return to practice or competition from a licensed physician or a licensed healthcare provider. Ohio North has provided a document that you may present to your physician to complete: [Return-to-Play Doctor Verification Letter](#)

## **Concussion Education**

To protect youth athletes, the State of Ohio has passed a concussion law, Bill 143. This bill is also known as the "Return to Play" law. This law, similar to the laws enacted in most other states, enforces training, safety, and awareness requirements on youth sports organizations, such as Ohio North, and its leagues, tournaments, coaches, referees, officials, and athletes and their families.

A concussion is an injury to the brain that may be caused by a blow, bump, or jolt to the head. Concussions may also happen after a fall or hit that jars the brain. A blow elsewhere on the body can cause a concussion even if an athlete does not hit his/her head directly. Concussions can range from mild to severe, and athletes can get a concussion even if they are wearing a helmet. Even though most concussions are mild, all concussions are potentially serious and may result in complications including prolonged brain damage and death if not recognized and managed properly.

Ohio North is giving the following expectations to its leagues, coaches, referees, officials, and athletes and their parents.

## **Training Requirements**

All of Ohio North's member leagues and tournaments are responsible to monitor and track their coaches' compliance with the concussion training requirements of the Return to Play law. The training must be renewed every three years. Leagues and tournaments must collect and maintain certificates of compliance from the coaches and may ask for evidence of compliance. At any time, Ohio North may request evidence of compliance with the training requirements and leagues must be able to produce confirmation for each coach.

All referees for Ohio North member league events and Ohio North-sponsored events must also be able to demonstrate that they have complied with the training requirements of Bill 143. Upon Ohio North's request, referees must be able to produce evidence of compliance with the training requirement.

## **Consequences of Failure to Comply with Ohio's Return to Play Law**

If a coach, referee, or official is knowingly not compliant with the Return to Play law, including training requirements and removal from play requirements, he or she could face civil liability ([see O.R.C. 3707.511 \(F\)\(1\)](#)) should a child become injured due to his failure to follow the law. Additionally, coaches, referees and officials who fail to follow the law may be rendered ineligible to participate in Ohio North member league events and Ohio North-sponsored events.

## **Coaches Responsibility**

In conjunction with completing the above training course or obtaining a Pupil Activity Permit, you must carry the following items while at practice or competitions:

## **Referee/Official Training**

Ohio North requires that all Referees and Officials comply with concussion training requirement of the Return to Play Law and recommends the above NFHS course. Referees should have a copy of their certificate on them at all time for proof of compliance. Referees should be able to send a copy of their certificate to referee assignors and to the league upon requesting this information at any time. More so, referee assignors shall not assign any referee to an Ohio North-sanctioned game or event without proof from the referee of their compliance to the concussion education.

### \*\*\*Referee Concussion Reporting Policy\*\*\*

Referees are required to notify the proper tournament or league officials for players removed from games for possible concussions as follows: 1) at Ohio North sanctioned tournament games, referees are to keep passes of players removed from games for possible concussions and turn those passes into the proper authorized personnel, to be held until the end of the tournament or until signed written medical authorization forms clearing the players have been received; 2) at league games, referees are to keep passes of players removed from games for possible concussions and return the player passes at the completion of the games; and 3) at recreational games, referees are to notify the proper tournament or league authorities of players removed from games for possible concussions.
