Front Range League Structure

9U and 10U

- Divisions are as follows:
 - Premier (9U in Spring only; 10U in Fall and Spring)
 - Intermediate Gold 1 & 2 Citywide
 - Intermediate Silver 1 & 2 (separated North and South if applicable)
 - Intermediate Bronze 1 & 2 (separated North and South if applicable)
 - Recreation Gold (separated North and South if applicable)
 - Recreation Silver (separated North and South if applicable)
 - Recreation Bronze (separated North and South if applicable)

Front Range League Structure

9U and 10U

- 7v7
- Unlimited subs that can occur at any stoppage
- Roster limit of 12
- Two 25-minute halves with 10-minute halftime
- No heading
- Offside is between build-out line and end line
- 6' x 18' or 6.5' x 18.5' goal



Front Range League Structure

9U and 10U Build-Out Line

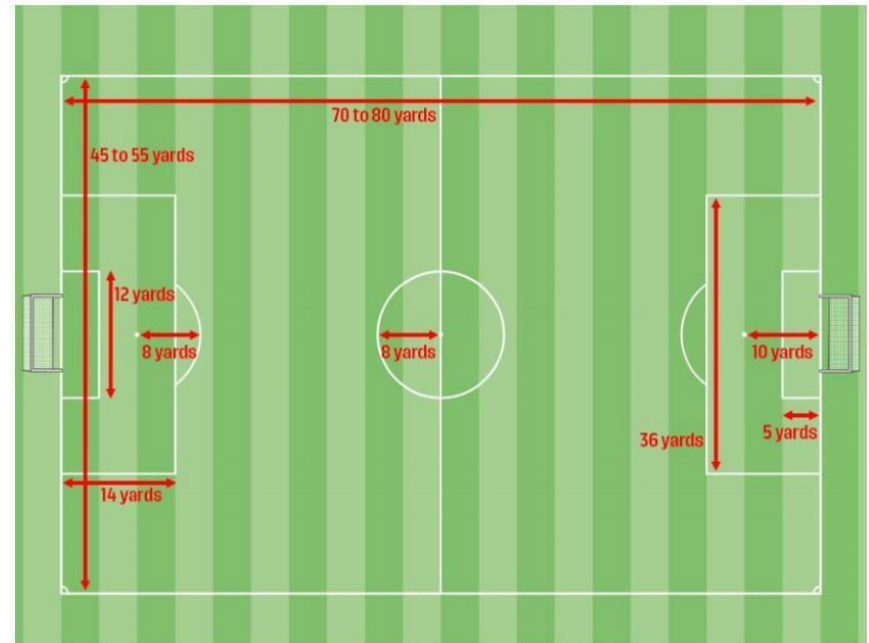
- Build-out line is a different colored or dotted line halfway between 12-yard box and halfway line.
- When GK has the ball, opposing team must retreat behind build-out line and wait until the ball is in play until encroaching.
- Ball is “in play” when the GK’s intended recipient receives the ball.
- GK cannot punt or drop kick the ball.



Front Range League Structure

11U and 12U

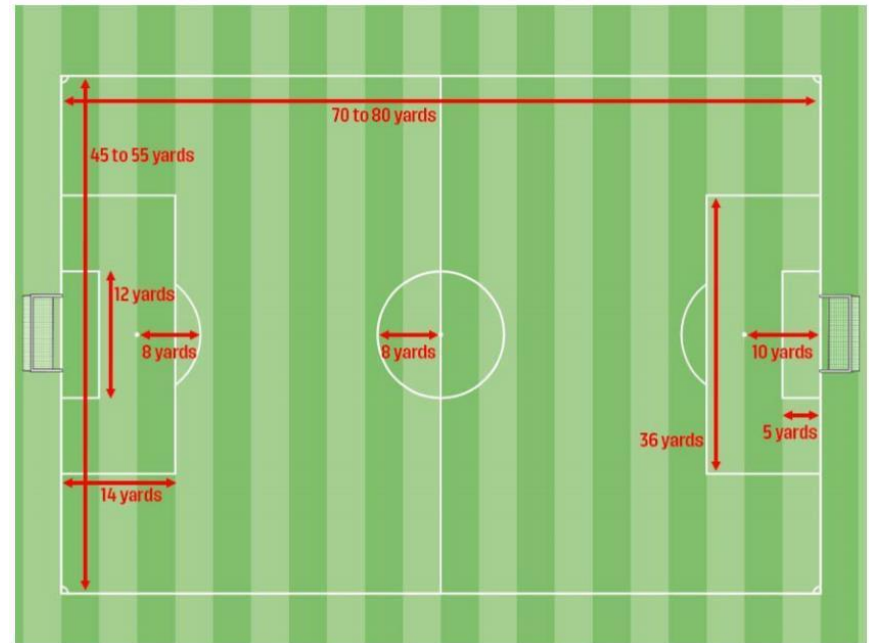
- Divisions are as follows:
 - Recreation Gold (separated North and South if applicable)
 - Recreation Silver (separated North and South if applicable)
 - Recreation Bronze (separated North and South if applicable)
- 9v9
- Unlimited subs that can occur at any stoppage
- Roster limit of 16
- Two 30-minute halves with 10-minute halftime
- Heading is allowed
- Offsides per the IFAB Laws of the Game
- 6.5' x 18.5' or 7' x 21' goal



Front Range League Structure

13U and 14U

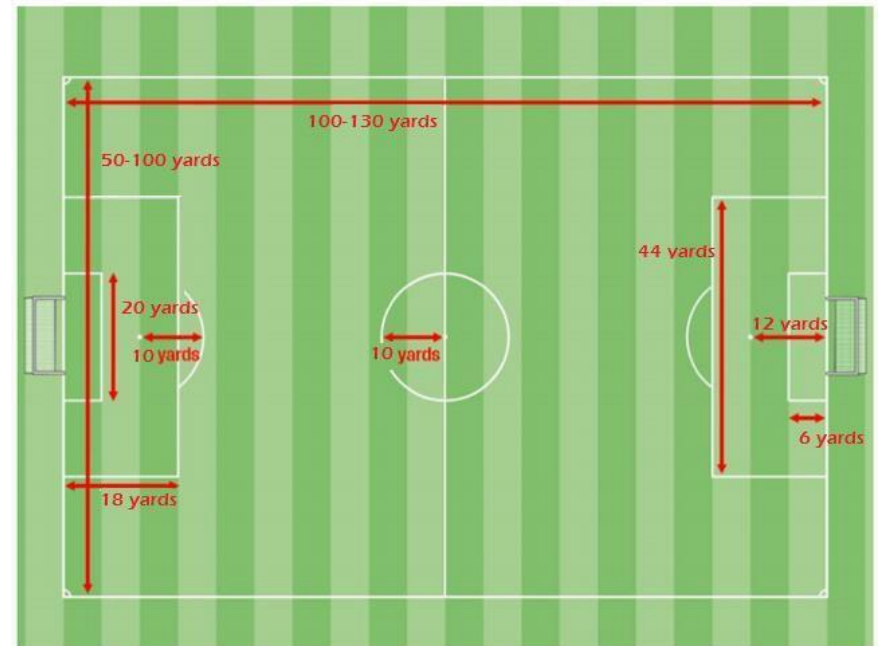
- Divisions are as follows:
 - Recreation Gold (separated North and South if applicable)
 - Recreation Silver (separated North and South if applicable)
 - Recreation Bronze (separated North and South if applicable)
- 9v9
- Unlimited subs that can occur at any stoppage
- Roster limit of 16
- Two 35-minute halves with 10-minute halftime
- Heading is allowed
- Offsides per the IFAB Laws of the Game
- 6.5' x 18.5' or 7' x 21' goal



Front Range League Structure

15U and 15U-19U

- All divisions are combined into one bracket
- 9v9
- Unlimited subs that can occur at any stoppage
- Roster limit of 18
- Two 40-minute halves with 10-minute halftime
- Heading is allowed
- Offsides per the IFAB Laws of the Game
- 8' x 24' goal



Front Range League Structure

Current Application Process and Fees

- Clubs register teams and request divisions.
- Strongly recommend that clubs request a spreadsheet of registered teams to ensure the requested division is correct.
- Registration fee is \$75 for all on-time registrants.
- A \$75 fee is added to all teams registered after the deadline.
 - Teams are only allowed to add late to fit appropriate gaps
- The \$75 registration fee still needs to be paid for teams dropped after the deadline.
- Invoices will be generated through GotSoccer after schedules post to ensure accuracy.

Front Range League Structure

Game Change Requests

- Game Officials relies on the schedule in GotSoccer for updates.
- Proper process is submitting the game change request through GotSoccer and Game Officials at the same time.
- GotSoccer takes 1-2 business days to process requests.
- Assignors check the public schedule on GotSoccer to make sure the change is correct before accepting the change in Game Officials.
- Home clubs should submit game change requests.
- There is **NO FEE** for Front Range League game changes.

Front Range League Structure

Score Reporting

- Coaches are responsible for entering scores following the conclusion of a game.
- Event ID and Pin# are sent to the clubs so they can forward onto their coaches.
- As of 11/29, two-and-a-half weeks after the last day to play & report, **1,283** scores are missing, including close to 200 from the Premier and Gold divisions in 9U and 10U.
- The LOC and clubs rely on standings when registering teams for the next season. Please emphasize with your coaches that scores need to be entered.

Front Range League Structure

Late Add/Drops

- Ongoing issue is the late add/drops of teams to the league.
- Fall 2018 FRL saw:
 - **21 drops**: 9 during the home scheduling process and 7 after schedules posted;
 - **7 adds**: All came during matchup generation;
 - **6 switches**: 2 during home scheduling and 1 after schedules posted
- Current structure sees \$75 paid for any late drops and \$150 paid for any late adds

Front Range League Structure

Late Add/Drops

- Fall 2019 will see a new payment structure to curb the late adjustments
 - \$75 for adds and \$0 for drops made before deadline
 - \$150 for adds and \$75 for drops made after deadline and before home scheduling opens
 - \$225 for adds (if it can be accommodated) and \$150 for drops during home scheduling
 - No adds will be accommodated after the day before home scheduling closes.
 - \$225 will be paid for any drops in which the schedule cannot be redone; this is typically in effect the day before home scheduling closes.

Recreational Player Fees and ID Numbers

- In order for players to get entered into the National Data Center and receive their FIFA and US Soccer ID Numbers, they must be uploaded and invoiced in GotSoccer.
- This also is mandatory for rec player registration and paying the \$10.50/player fee, which covers insurance.
- Uploading requires certain fields, but it is the only way to get fees paid and get their FIFA and USSF number.
- Not having the required fields or having blank cells cause issues, so it's a matter of getting the information during registration.

Risk Management

- Background check, concussion test, and abuse prevention are required for all coaches and assistant coaches by CSA and US Soccer.
- Managers are only required to complete the background check.
- The coaches and manager cannot be rostered with a team until these requirements are met.
- Originally, 1-2 days was the initial processing time set by SSCI. Since then, with the huge influx, it was more around 7-10 days.

Risk Management

- Coaches and managers login to GotSoccer, where they fill in their information, submit the check, and complete the concussion test.
- The background check is sent from GotSoccer to SSCI, who processes the check and sends the result back to GotSoccer.
- If the coach has a completed background check on file, they can be added to rosters.
- If the coach serves with multiple clubs, as long as the first name, last name, date of birth, and email address are identical on the different accounts, the coach or club can login and click “Check Reports” and the completed check will copy over.
- After it’s copied over, the same can be done under the Concussion Test.

International Clearance

- As of today, International Clearance (ITC) is not required for all players unless the player is playing in the Development Academy (DA).
- If the player is playing in any CSA leagues, the birth certificate is submitted as usual so that CSA can verify the date of birth.
- CSA strongly recommends clubs submit ITC for any players with foreign birth certificates as US Soccer requirements may change at any given time.
- While the ITC is being processed by US Soccer, the player will be permitted to play in CSA leagues.

- Open to all teams that play in Centennial League



- 9U-19U
- Open to all teams that play in Front Range League, in-house, and inter-league



- 6U-8U
- Open to all teams that play in-house and inter-league

Club Roles and Information in GotSoccer

- Mailing addresses and contact information must be up-to-date in your GotSoccer account.
- Certain club roles and staff must have user account created in the system as we will be putting together distribution lists and reach out to the club based upon this information.

 - President
 - Vice President
 - Treasurer
 - Board Member
 - Executive Director
 - Risk Manager
 - Director of Coaching (all of them)
 - Registrar (all of them)
 - Assistant Registrar
 - Tournament Director
 - League Representative
 - Field Coordinator
 - Referee Assignor
 - Staff



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
