What is the rationale for going with Grade Groups as compared to the new Age Groups for MTOC and Intown Recreational Leagues?

In order to comply with the new calendar year based age group labels and continue to have children play with their peer same grade classmates a new group label is needed. By moving from the August-July to the Jan-Dec birthdate range players in the same grade will have two different age group labels. Using the dual group method provides for players to possibly have three different age group labeled players play in just a dual two year grade group. Also, if the new full calendar year and age group label were to be used next soccer year, players in an older grade could play town with a younger grade because they meet the age group birth year. For example the U7 age group would be comprised of older Kindergarten and younger 1<sup>st</sup> graders. Thus, in order to keep children of the same class year together, the simple change of the label of playing groups to Grade Based groups with date of birth criteria makes this easier. Using this method still operates within the coming mandates from US Soccer.

How does this Grade Group method work for recreational MTOC and Intown Recreational play and why the birthdates start of 1/1/xxxx?

Two examples will be used to help demonstrate how this applies. Note these are based on the 2016/17 soccer year.

- Recreational Intown Leagues – Grade 1 Group Example:
  - The new Grade 1 Group (formerly U7) will be comprised of players in the 1st grade or below AND born on or after 1/1/2009. Under new US Soccer player calendar year age group labels, players in this Grade 1 Group will primarily be comprised of players labeled as older U7 and younger U8. The bulk of these players will be born between 8/1/2009 and 7/31/2010, virtually identical to the current birth date ranges in use today.
  - There are some players who have a birthdate that would have typically placed them in an older grade in school, but for whatever reason, they attend school in the next lower grade. Players born earlier, before 1/1/2009, and in 1<sup>st</sup> grade may apply for a waiver from their organization.
- MTOC Travel League Play – Grade 7/8 Example:
  - The new Grade 7/8 Group (formerly U14) will be comprised of players in 8<sup>th</sup> grade or below AND born on or after 1/1/2002. Under new US Soccer player calendar year age group labels, players in this Grade 7/8 Group will primarily be comprised of players labeled as older U13, all U14 and younger U15. The bulk of these players will be born between 8/1/2002 and 7/31/2004, virtually identical to the current birth date ranges in use today.
  - There are some players who have a birthdate that would have typically placed them in an older grade in school, but for whatever reason, they attend school in the next lower grade. Having them play with their classmates was possible by waiver and only granted for them to Division 3, 4 or 5 players. Now those players born on or after 1/1/2002 can play with classmates without the need for waivers and play on a Division 1 or 2 team. Players born earlier, before 1/1/2002, and in 8<sup>th</sup> grade may apply for a waiver from their organization.
  - If this team were to enter a tournament with divisions based on Age Groups they would have to enter in the division based on the oldest player's age group label. Since the oldest player on the team could be born in 2002 this team would have to enter the tournament as a U15 team.

How do we use the Born Between Date criteria?

Many organizations prefer to start with a finite birth date parameter for registrations and then look at each player who may “play up”. For example, using the Grade 7/8 Group the birth date criteria is “born on or after 1/1/2002”. Using a Born By date the parameters could be “born between 1/1/2002 and 7/31/2004”. This method would catch virtually all 7<sup>th</sup> and 8<sup>th</sup> graders. If this team were to compete in a tournament outside of MTOC it would be labeled a U15 team if any players on the team are born in 2002.
