

Ejections Clarification

All of the following rules apply to the First State Cup.

In DYSA Player and Team Registration Regulations and Administration, Ejections and Cautions Rule I.C it states:

Any player ejected from any DYSA or USYSA sanctioned match shall be suspended from participation in his/her next scheduled DYSA or USYSA sanctioned match, regardless of where or when that next match is actually played.

In First State Cup Rules Governing Play Section III.C it states:

A player or coach ejected from a game must sit out the balance of that game and the next scheduled game unless the ejection was for fighting, in which case the player or coach is ineligible for the remainder of the State Cup. Where applicable the suspension will carry over from year to year.

And in the National Championship rule 225 section 3 it states:

Players who are ejected from any championship game may not be allowed to participate in the next immediately following championship game played by the player's team. A player may receive more than a one-game suspension

Examples:

1. A player/coach is ejected from a league/tournament game and the next game is a national championship game then that player/coach is ineligible to play in that national championship game. This includes State Cup and Regional's.
2. A player/coach is ejected from a national championship game and their next game is a league/tournament game. That player/coach must sit out the next league/tournament game **and** the next national championship game.

What does this mean to the coach/team? In the national rules it states:

Any team found guilty of using an ineligible player is not eligible to compete further in the Championship competitions in the current seasonal year. Any coach, manager, or official found guilty of knowingly using an ineligible player is not eligible to compete further in the Championship competitions in the current and subsequent seasonal year. A player found guilty of submitting falsified birth information is prohibited from competing further in Championship competitions in the current and subsequent seasonal year.
